Mon 30th October 2023, ASN Parent Forum Presentation, Carrongrange High School
Extract relating to Enhanced Support.

Script: Many children with stage 3 ASN have their needs well met in their school. However, about 50% of all applications to Enhanced Provision PCP (Placement Change Panel) are declined. We have therefore placed an additional 22 teachers into our Primary schools so that more children can continue to have their needs met with the right support at the right time. This effectively provides support for approx. 200 more pupils at stage 3 /4 in our mainstream primaries. We anticipate our applications for Enhanced Provision will reduce accordingly.

Due to forward planning information, we cannot know locations for our Enhanced Provision placements until Feb/March, therefore we have decided to hold our panel in February. We know this supports schools and families to gather the right assessment evidence, as on resubmission, previously declined requests are often granted. We hope this will avoid the need to submit to panel twice. It also means we can advise parents of their location at the same time as placement agreement.

Of the children currently placed in Primary Enhanced Provision, approx. 70% are no longer in their catchment school. Half of these pupils are not in their original Secondary catchment. Many of our parents have been faced with the difficult choice of moving their child's location to benefit from the right support. Our additional resources to Primary schools should give more choice to parents to have their child's needs met in their catchment school. Finally, keeping children in their catchment community will prevent additional transitions for children; peer and community relationships will be maintained. We will ask for parental and school feedback at the end of this session to make improvements for the next session. We appreciate parents may feel transitions are late, but this is always the case as we cannot confirm locations until March annually. We will be providing further guidance to schools around transitions to Enhanced Provisions.
